Media Freedom in the age of Tech Disruption Royal Library of Belgium (Koninklijke Bibliotheek Royale), Mont des Arts, Brussels 20 April 2022, 12:30 – 18:00 (CEST)

About the event

This conference will look at the tension between media freedom and the new age of information technology. How can we embrace technologies that help media progress, into sustainable business models that ensure credibility, reliability and media freedom?

Some of Europe's member states are suffering from "traditional" attacks on media freedom, where journalists are restricted or even attacked in their work, outlets are censored and the general media landscape is being suffocated, such as in Hungary, Poland or Slovenia.

Further to this, digitalisation processes shifted the consummation of media from the traditional printed outlets, radio and television towards digital platforms. The downfall of advertisement incomes triggered a shift in strategies. Media companies engaged takeovers and merges into large conglomerates, threatening media plurality. We see online clickbait articles to generate more revenue, but they focus more on quantity instead of quality. Some countries subsidise media, or just take over companies to use them as propaganda channels.

Decentralisation of content creation could be a part of the solution, but at the same time we see the effects of fake news rising. Polarisation is further reinforced by algorithms that focus on generating revenue for social media platforms, leaving out other viewpoints and facts for individual users. The pressure on profitability sometimes causes to cut expenses on cost intensive investigative journalism that functions as a safeguard for liberal democracies.

There are many challenges ahead. Therefore, ELF brings together leading think tanks across Europe, presenting you perspectives straight from Warsaw, Budapest, Prague, Berlin, Sofia, London. National policies in Freedom of the Press and Media Plurality will play a vital role in securing a free and democratic future for all Europeans. The EU's proposed European Media Freedom Act will be a chance to ensure transparency and independence, whilst highlighting the need for more opportunities within the internal market and for an update to media business models to fit with the needs of Europe's digital transformation.
