ELF's Strategy and Mission

Our Liberal Vision

O Tara ca Afara was established in 2021 with the main goal to monitor the implementation of Romania's Recovery and Resilience plan, focusing particularly on the specific reforms that are key to the country's liberal transition, as well as more in general, to its modernization through an impactful absorption of all EU funds. Moving forward, it continued to develop, expanding its area of activity towards becoming a strong liberal voice in the country and think tank arena. Being founded by Cristian Ghinea, former USR minister of Investments and European Projects and chief negotiator for Romania's Recovery and Resilience Plan, the organisation was able to capture the attention of a wide public following this specific topic and its exposure continues to grow. The main objective is to position the organisation as a strong liberal voice, something Romania truly needs to have in a moment of decreasing trust in the EU shared by the citizens. Our vision is of a liberal, prosperous European Union that offers opportunity, security, and belonging for all. A Europe in which the values of individual freedom, open society, equality, democracy, and the rule of law are not only enshrined, but actively defended. We seek to build a stronger, bolder, and more independent Europe—one where citizens feel economically secure, empowered to take charge of their own futures, and excited about what lies ahead. As a European political foundation, ELF plays a unique role in turning this vision into reality—by shaping public discourse, influencing policy development, and fostering collaboration among liberal actors.



Owning the Future

At the European Liberal Forum, we believe that sticking to the past only sets us back, thus, liberals must look ahead. Our motto, "Owning the future" means moving forward with confidence, adapting to new challenges while defending what truly matters: our quality of life, our freedom, and our shared security. Rather than fearing what lies ahead, we choose to lead. We choose to shape Europe's path through innovation, resilience, and unity, by empowering citizens and liberal organisations to face change not as a threat, but as an opportunity.

Our Strategic Focus in 2024

In 2024, ELF's work under the *Ideas Pillar* was guided by three strategic vectors. These priorities aligned with the broader liberal agenda and reflected our shared commitment with the ALDE Party and the Renew Europe Group to a more resilient and forward-looking Europe. They also responded to emerging geopolitical, economic, technological, and democratic trends shaping Europe's future. Each vector reflects a key liberal value and a core area where ELF has added value by sparking ideas, connecting actors, and translating principles into action.



A Prosperous, Innovative and Future-Oriented Europe

As liberals, we believe that technology and innovation can bring our societies forward. It is up to us to steer technology in the right way so that we can all benefit from it. Techno-Politics explores how technologies shape, and are shaped by, political power, regulations and democratic norms. Techno-Sustainability refers to the use of technology to promote clean and sustainable practices. Research topics include the global AI race, the governance of digital platforms, upskilling the European workforce to use new technological tools and efficient energy use.

A Democratic, Just and Free Europe

Europe is dealing with multiple social challenges such as the cost-of-living crisis and housing crisis. The welfare state and other modern social systems must deliver better. At the same time, our liberal values are also under threat in Europe. A resilient democracy is characterised by trust and strong institutions free from corruption, robust political participation, and a vibrant civil society. Research topics in this area deal with liberal solutions to social issues, the future of cohesion policy, the role of civil society LGBTQI+ rights, and strategies to counter the rise of illiberal forces.

ELF's impact in 2023

Each output reflects our values and stands as a testament to what the European Liberal Forum represents. Through a wide range of projects, publications, and partnerships carried out in collaboration with our member organisations, we have advanced our strategic priorities and deepened our impact across Europe. Key topics for the year:

Techno-Politics

Technology can be a powerful tool and ally in addressing issues of sustainability, democracy, climate change, and much more, but it can also be the downfall; it is a double-edged sword that must be managed. As a forward-looking organisation, ELF continues to prioritise techno-politics as a critical area of action. In 2024, we deepened this commitment through a series of *stakeholder dialogues* bringing together industry stakeholders, MEPs, and civil society actors. Additionally, the third edition of the *Techno-Politics Forum* reinforced the importance of an inclusive, forward-looking approach to digital governance, ensuring that technology remains a force for democracy and sustainability.

In 2024, ELF also released a dedicated publication on how liberal values can guide the integration of new technologies into democratic societies. *Digitalisation and Liberal Values* is all about safeguarding freedom by setting boundaries in the digital world. The book explores how key principles, such as individual freedom, transparency, accountability, and the rule of law, can form the foundation for a value-based approach to digitalisation.

Artificial intelligence (AI) technologies are inherently global, transcending national borders and requiring international cooperation on AI legislation. Our publication <u>The Regulation of Artificial Intelligence: Shaping Governance and Power Relations for a Liberal Future</u> provides valuable insights into the evolving landscape of AI regulation.

European Security

Defence and security have become increasingly important topics in recent years. These issues have gained urgency and relevance in the shifting global order, becoming more tangible for citizens and policymakers alike. The development of the fifth edition of the *Future Europe Journal on Defence* in 2024 was a timely response to this global crisis. The journal was created to be a reference point for liberals navigating some of the most pressing dilemmas in defence and security today.

Our <u>policy papers on Taiwan-EU relations</u> outline key opportunities for deeper EU-Taiwan cooperation, including cybersecurity collaboration, trade diversification, and strategic regional engagement, while also addressing risks such as geopolitical tensions, economic dependencies, and China's influence on EU policy.

Russia's war against Ukraine, and a more aggressive American approach to China put the European industries in a tough position, making competitiveness jump to the top of the European agenda. Our study Sustainable? Competitive? The EU's Industrial Autonomy — Facts and Fantasies provides recommendations on how the EU can achieve industrial autonomy while upholding security, sustainability, and competitiveness.

Democratic, Just and Free Europe

With rising authoritarianism and populism, the threat to democracy is more tangible than ever before. In an era marked by global uncertainty and democratic backsliding,

human rights and liberal values must not only be protected, they must be actively strengthened and advanced. A flagship contribution to the conversation on democratic resilience in 2024 was the publication on *European Liberalism in the 21st Century*. By tracing how liberal principles can be translated into practical solutions, the paper offers a reflection on how liberalism can enable Europe and its citizens to thrive in a rapidly changing world.

ELF's study <u>Opportunities for All: Solutions for Liberals to Own the Social and Human Rights Agenda Again</u> explores how European liberals can reclaim leadership on social policy and human rights amidst rising inequality, illiberalism, and societal change. It presents innovative, liberal-driven policy proposals across economic, social, and rights-based issues, aimed at shaping the EU's next policy cycle for a fairer and more inclusive Europe.

The COVID-19 pandemic, geopolitical tensions and the climate crisis have exacerbated mental health challenges across Europe. Our study *Fundamental Mental Health*, addresses the escalating mental health crisis in Europe, exacerbated by factors like the COVID-19 pandemic, social inequalities, and rising populism. It explores the links between mental health and liberal values, emphasizing the need for systemic, inclusive approaches across health systems, education, and social policies.

Onboarding the New MEPs

2024 was a year of elections and institutional transformation. The European elections brought a wave of change across the EU institutions. But getting elected is only half the battle—settling in, understanding the system, and preparing for the next five years is a challenge in itself. Recognising this, ELF, together with its partners, launched a comprehensive onboarding initiative for new and returning Members of the European Parliament. The programme included tailored materials, hands-on workshops, and capacity-building sessions designed to equip MEPs with the tools and insights needed to thrive in a complex political environment.

The sessions focused on a range of forward-looking topics including self-development, strategic autonomy, techno-politics, and resilient supply chains. Open discussions provided space to exchange best pracitces, on topics such as, team management, decision-making, and long-term political planning.

As a cornerstone of this initiative, ELF published the handbook *Renewing Europe: A How-to Guide for EU Policymakers*, in collaboration with the Friedrich Naumann Foundation Europe. This publication emerged from the ELF-FNF Policy Labs, a two-day conference held in Brussels on 6–7 April 2024. It reflects the insights and proposals shaped by liberal experts and newly elected officials working together to define a roadmap for the next legislative term. But success in politics is not just about gaining power but about using it wisely, ethically, and sustainably. Our publication *Confronting the 10 Traps of Power* provides a practical survival guide for navigating the challenges of power in political leadership.
